

City Council Meeting:

- ❖ The Planning Commission had an early meeting this month to review the rezoning of a property at 110 East Liberty. The property was zoned OS-1 (office) at one point and they wanted to convert the property back to its original R-2 (single family). A public hearing was conducted and a vote to approve this was made sending it to City Council.
- ❖ At the 1/27 City Council meeting we had the first reading on the rezoning of 110 East Liberty. We will vote at our next Council meeting in February.
- ❖ There was a presentation from the Denny Craycraft Veterans Memorial Park to determine if a fund raiser could be done on the site in February. They are thinking that each branch of the service would be represented in a three day camping fund raiser. More to come as the details get finalized.
- ❖ Bruce Meyers attended the Rec Board meeting and gave updates that the Kayak Launch, Silk City Trail and Basketball courts are all moving forward but not until weather improves.

City thoughts:

- ❖ We have hired Williams and Works to help us as a Certified Planner. Andy Moore (AICP) attended our Planning Commission meeting and will be helping the Commission and City Council with training and planning recommendations. This will be a great resource for our community.
- ❖ We had a Housing Commission meeting to discuss the Cooperation Agreement between the City and the Housing Commission. The original Housing Commission was developed in 1950 by the City along with the original *Cooperation Agreement*, that is still valid today. This year the Housing Commission will have its 70th Birthday celebration.
- ❖ We dodged the ice storm a couple of weeks back and weather has been good for the most part. A reminder that we still do not have overnight street parking in effect.
